#### ARKANSAS FORESTRY COMMISSION

#### Minutes

April 26, 2024 10:00 a.m.

Chair Ray Dillon convened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. at the Arkansas Department of Agriculture, 1 Natural Resources Drive, Little Rock, AR 72205.

Commissioner(s) present: Steve Anthony, David Cawein, Ray Dillon, George Dunklin,

John McAlpine, Rob Parkes, Peter Prutzman, Frank Wilson

Commissioner(s) absent: Miles Goggans

Consider minutes of the January 26, 2024, Arkansas Forestry Commission meeting.

Moved by Parkes, seconded by Wilson to approve the minutes as presented.

#### Motion carried.

Darren Spinks presented the Arkansas Forestry Commission Registered Foresters Committee meeting report for the meeting held this morning.

Spinks stated the Committee recommends approval for Tim Morin to become a Registered Forester in Arkansas through reciprocity, pending verification paperwork from California showing he has passed the California exam.

Moved by Dillon, seconded by Anthony to approve Morin to become a Registered Forester in Arkansas, pending verification of the proper paperwork from California.

#### Motion carried.

Spinks stated a Registered Foresters exam was given on February 28, 2024. Seven students from University of Arkansas at Monticello (UAM) passed the exam. The Committee recommends approval to issue a Registered Foresters license for the seven students passing the exam, pending verification of their final transcripts and reference confirmation.

Moved by Dillon, seconded by Prutzman to approve the Committee's recommendation on the seven students, pending verification of their final transcript and reference confirmation.

Motion carried.

The Committee recommends that the Commission support allowing John McAlpine and Dr. Matthew Pilkki to attend the Association of Southeastern Boards for Registration for Foresters meeting to represent Arkansas, and to be reimbursed by the Arkansas Department of Agriculture for expenses.

Moved by Dillon, seconded by Wilson to approve the Committee's request.

#### Motion carried.

The Committee reviewed the Arkansas Department of Agriculture Board of Registration for Foresters cash funds financial report for the period July 1, 2023 – March 31, 2024.

Cunningham introduced the following:

- Nikki Davis, new District Forester for District 8 in northeast and north Arkansas. Davis is the first female District Forester in Arkansas' history.
- David Blythe, new Forest Health Specialist
- Bernard Iwegbu, new Tree Equity Grants Coordinator with Urban Forestry
- Candice Schnebelen, new Agri Program Manager Licensing Coordinator

#### **Forest Management Report**

Jim Jolley, Assistant State Forester, gave an update on Baucum Nursery. The 2024 crop has been completed with a little over seven million seedlings sold, resulting in approximately \$1.7 million in sales. The 2025 crop planting is 66% complete with the planting to be completed by May.

Jolley stated a grant proposal was presented to the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation for \$326,000 to be used to restore thirty and a half acres in the northeast corner of Baucum Nursery. These acres will be used for production of hardwoods.

Jolley stated, during the third quarter, four tracts totaling 43.61 acres in the Hot Springs State Forest was purchased. The total current acres purchased equals 3,272 acres. A purchase agreement has been signed to purchase additional acres.

Jolly stated they are in the process of purchasing a 1.54-acre tract in Baxter County. The acreage will serve as a new work center for the county. The tract was purchased with an Arkansas Natural and Cultural Resources Council (ANCRC) grant.

Chandler Barton, Division Forester reported on the pine health monitoring since late 2022 regarding pine health issues in southeastern Arkansas. Forty-one samples were collected across the southeast in the affected areas. All samples were sent to two different labs. Mississippi State University Chemical Laboratory for confirmation or diagnosis of the presence of dicamba or paraquat. Samples from the same trees were also sent to a pathology lab in Pineville, LA for confirmation of brown spot needle blight. Two of those samples tested positive for paraquat and zero samples tested positive for dicamba. Approximately two-thirds of the samples collected tested positive for brown spot needle blight. Further research is being done to develop management strategies.

Three Urban and Community Forestry staff were introduced:

- Kristine (Krissy) Kimbro Urban Forestry Coordinator
- Harold Fisher Urban Forestry Partnership Coordinator
- Bernard Iwegbu Tree Equity Grants Specialist

Kimbro gave a report on the ReLeaf Program which is in partnership with the Arkansas Urban Forestry Council, funded through a sub award annually. One of the components of their grant requirement is that they hold a ReLeaf event every year, meant to reforest the urban and community forestry canopy in an area that has been hit by tornado or some other natural disaster. One event was held in North Little Rock with 400 seedlings and 60 potted trees being given away. One hundred and thirty were in attendance. Another event was held in Wynne with 1,550 seedlings and 225 potted trees being given away with 350 in attendance. Kimbro stated currently, 10,500 seedlings have been given away this year.

Chair Dillon brought new business to the Commission. Miles Goggans sent an email to Cunningham requesting either a statement or resolution be prepared, honoring the life of David H. Pryor, expressing gratitude for his contributions, his public service, his impact on forestry in the state of Arkansas, and our condolences to his family.

Moved by Dunklin, seconded by Parkes to have staff create a resolution consistent with Goggins' request.

Motion carried.

#### **Emergency Services Report**

Robert Murphy, Emergency Services Director, reported on wildfire statistics. In January there were 7 fires with 60 acres burned, in February, 214 fires with 6,812 acres burned, and in March, 112 fires with 3,093 acres burned, finishing the quarter with 333 fires and 9,965 acres burned.

Murphy reported on training classes being conducted within the districts.

The Posting Paint proposed rule has been through the promulgation procedure and is now waiting to be reviewed by the Legislative Council at the end of May. The Qualified Prescribed Burner rule went into effect in March.

#### **Deputy State Forester's Report**

Darren Spinks, Deputy State Forester, reported on district highlights. There have been 76 prescribed burns conducted this quarter treating a total of 6,600 acres.

Spinks reported on Poison Spring State Forest with seven sales of 25,432 tons of pine sawtimber at an average of \$40.83 per ton.

#### **Marketing and Communications Report**

Ayden Massey, Public Information Officer, covered the marketing and communications report to include:

#### **Human Resources Report**

Cunningham reported the Division has 262 filled positions and is in a good place with filled/advertised positions. Cunningham stated they are working hard on recruitment and retention.

#### **Fiscal Division Report**

Inoussa Zaki, Chief Fiscal Officer, summarized the Arkansas Forestry Division's quarterly report, shown as **Attachment 2**.

Zaki stated the Division finished the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter with \$5,845.702 in operating cash balance, reporting a little over \$16 million in expenditures. The Division is in a good position entering the last quarter of 2024.

#### **State Forester's Report**

Cunningham gave an overview of the accomplishments and overall direction of all projects within the Division.

Three students have been awarded Foresters for the Future scholarships. The first recipient, Shylee Head, will be graduating in two weeks. Head has accomplished much during her education. Head thanked the Commission and the Department for awarding her the scholarship to help with her education and future career.

Cunningham stated a hearing concerning a complaint will be held at 1:00 following a lunch break. Tanner Thomas, Arkansas Department of Agriculture Attorney, stated the respondent has entered a waiver of physical appearance along with a full response and exhibits packet.

Chair Dillon set the next quarterly meeting date for Friday, July 12, 2024, at 10:00 a.m.

The meeting was recessed for lunch.

Upon reconvening, Thomas stated a complaint was submitted by Harold McAlpine. Thomas reviewed the waiver of appearance cover letter from counsel for the respondent; an affidavit signed and notarized by the respondent, Paul Williams; and the affidavit of compliance signed by Paul Williams.

Thomas reviewed a cover letter sent to the Respondent's council, Greg Vardaman, along with an Affidavit of Compliance (Affidavit) to be presented to Williams to constitute a settlement between the Respondent and the Arkansas Forestry Commission on Docket No. 2023-02 only upon a majority vote of a quorum of the Commission. The Affidavit was signed by the Respondent and returned.

Anthony stated, he would suggest there be a revised Affidavit drafted, to add wording that the Respondent, Paul Williams, will not represent himself as a forest manager, and will not represent himself as working for a full-service forest company, and not to have the hearing today.

The Hearing Officer present, Chris Madison, suggested to table the hearing, to be reset for another date, with the provision that staff provide a revision of the Affidavit that meets the terms the Commission is requesting.

Moved by Cawein, seconded by Dillon to table the hearing, directing staff to provide a revision of the Affidavit as discussed, and reset the hearing for 1:00 p.m. at the next quarterly Commission meeting on July 12, 2024.

Motion carried.

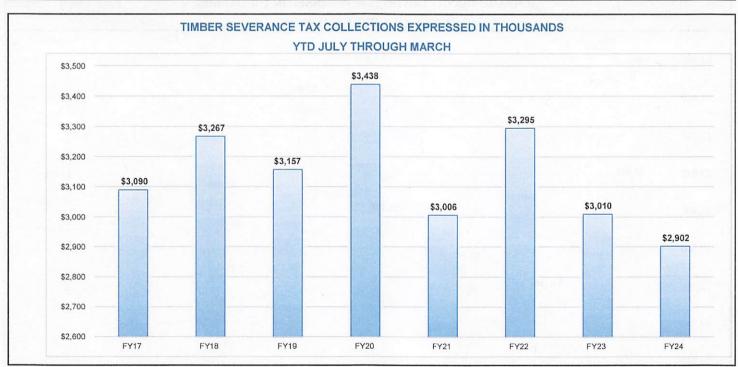
