Chair Matthew Marsh called the quarterly Board meeting to order.

Scott Bray, Director, Plant Industries Division, and other Arkansas Department of Agriculture staff were in attendance.

1. Opening comments and introductions

Chair Marsh welcomed all who were in attendance and asked each member to introduce themselves and state who they represent.

2. Consider minutes of the March 5, 2024 Plant Board meeting

Moved by Dunklin, seconded by Angel, to approve the Plant Board meeting minutes as presented.

Motion carried.

3. Pest Control Section

Committee Chair Dr. Korth summarized the minutes of the May 28, 2024 Pest Control Committee meeting. **Attachment 3A**.

It was brought to the committee's attention by Scott Bray, Director, Plant Industries Division, the pest control regulations state "This Committee shall consist of the Board member who represents the Head of the Department of Entomology, University of Arkansas, who shall act as the Chairman,". Bray stated that he was reminded of the regulation while recently reviewing the rules. It was discussed that the Committee chair position shifted from the U of A member to other Plant Board members because the U of A Board member that filled this position reassigned. The U of A position was vacant, or an interim person was assigned, or the position was combined with another position within the U of A during a period of reorganization. During this time other Board members were assigned to chair this Committee. After discussion it was determined that Dr. Ken Korth should replace Mr. Bruce Alford as the Pest Control Committee Chairman,

Two Informal Resolution Agreements of pest control incidents were presented by staff:

• Case File #24.166 – Brightview – 3rd level of enforcement action for failure to register agents and agreed to an informal resolution of \$1,400.00 dollars.

Moved by Dr. Korth, seconded by Alford to approve the minutes of the May 28, 2024 Pest Control meeting as presented.

Motion carried.

Dr. Korth presented the pest control examination results for the months of March through May 2024. **Attachment 3B**

Moved by Dr. Korth, seconded by Alford to approve the exam results as presented.

Motion carried.

4. Pesticide Program

Committee Chair Dunklin summarized the minutes of the May 22, 2024 Pesticide Committee meeting. **Attachment 4A**.

Leigh Gibson, Pesticide Enforcement Program Manager provided an overview of case file documents and investigation procedures.

Staff presented 16 warning letters and 5 civil penalties to the Committee for review and recommendation to the Board.

The Committee voted to present the enforcement actions to the Plant Board for final approval. Garrett Frost recused himself from Enforcement actions 1, 3, 8, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21.

Moved by Dunklin, seconded by Gammill to approve the enforcements actions as presented. Noted that Frost recusing his vote as stated above.

Motion carried.

Susie Nichols, Pesticide Section Manager, provided the Committee an update and example of the new semi-automated license database and process.

Nichols provided an update to the Committee on general information, type of license needed, FAA requirements, and contact information regarding drone use for pesticide applications.

Chair Dunklin introduced Dr. Jason Davis, Assistant Professor of Remote Sensing and Pesticide Application, University of Arkansas Systems Division of Agriculture.

Dr. Davis discussed evolving technology of spray drones for agricultural applications. PowerPoint presentation shown as **Attachment 4B**.

Board discussion followed.

Chair Dunklin continued, stating Bray provided the Committee with an update on the webinar regarding the future in-crop use of dicamba.

Bray stated no one has challenged the EPA ruling not to register the three in-crop dicamba products. Bayer and BASF are in the beginning stages of having new products introduced to be registered. Therefore, there will not be a registered incrop dicamba product available for next year's growing season.

Moved by Dunklin, seconded by Meyer to approve the minutes of the May 22, 2024 Pesticide Committee meeting as presented.

Motion carried.

5. Bureau of Standards Program

Committee Chair Robin Ralston summarized the minutes of the Bureau of Standards Committee meeting held May 14, 2024. **Attachment 5**

Staff presented 96 civil penalties to the committee for review and recommendation to the Board:

The meeting was called to order at 9:03 AM by the interim committee chair, Bruce Alford.

Scott Bray, Arkansas Department of Agriculture, brought to the attention of the committee that the pest control regulations state that the chairman of the committee shall be the U of A representative from the Entomology Department. Bray stated that he was reminded of the regulation while recently reviewing the rules. Bray and Dr. Ken Korth proceeded to discuss their memories of how the committee chair position shifted from the U of A member to other Plant Board members. They noted that several years ago the U of A Board member that filled this position resigned and that there were several years when either an interim person was assigned, or the position was combined with another position within the U of A system. During this time other Board members were assigned to chair this committee. After discussion it was determined that Dr. Ken Korth should replace Mr. Bruce Alford as the Pest Control Committee Chairman. For the remainder of the meeting Dr. Korth conducted the process.

Dr. Korth called on Seth Dunlap to present to the committee members with the following:

- 1. Resolution of Pest Control Incident (attachment 1)
- 2. Resolution of Pest Control Incident (attachment 2)

Mr. Dunlap gave a summary of the first Resolution Agreement for Case File #24.166 (See attachment 1). The incident occurred on April 3, 2024, with Brightview. Mr. Dunlap listed the findings of the case file. He notes that the \$1400 civil penalty was agreed to be paid.

Mr. Dunlap confirmed verified compliance was conducted at the conclusion to ensure that everything was in order.

Committee Chair Dr. Korth requested a motion to accept the agreement. Baltz made the motion. Angel seconded. Vote was made and motion carried.

Mr. Dunlap gave a summary of the second Resolution Agreement for Case File #24.167 (See attachment 2). The incident occurred on April 10, 2024, with N.E.A. Turf Care, Inc. Mr. Dunlap listed the findings of the case file. He notes that the \$600 civil penalty was agreed to be paid.

Committee Chair Dr. Korth requested a motion to accept the agreement. Allford made the motion. Frost seconded. Vote was made and motion carried.

Committee Chair Dr. Korth stated that both agreements will be brought before the board on June 6th, 2024.

Committee Chair Dr. Korth requested a motion to adjourn the meeting. Allford made the motion. Baltz seconded. Meeting was adjourned.

RESOLUTION OF PEST CONTROL INCIDENT

This resolution of a pest control incident is entered into by the Arkansas Department of Agriculture (Department) and Brightview, Shaun Henderson, Josh Luttrell and Philip Moore (Respondents) pursuant to the authority of the Arkansas Pest Control Law, Act 488 of 1975, as amended, codified at Ark. Code Ann. § 17-37-101 et. seq. and the rules promulgated thereunder by the Arkansas State Plant Board (Plant Board).

In lieu of a formal hearing on this complaint, and in the interest of prompt and speedy settlement of the alleged violations specifically addressed herein, consistent with the public interest, statutory requirements, and the responsibilities of the Plant Board, the undersigned parties enter into this Consent Agreement as a final disposition of this matter. This agreement shall settle and resolve only those alleged violations specifically addressed herein. It is agreed and stipulated by the parties as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent Brightview employs Respondent Shaun Henderson as the License Holder Representative and Licensed Operator.
- 2. On April 3, 2024, Respondent Brightview was found to have two unregistered Agents performing a pest control service without being under the direct supervision of a qualified trainer. The Department inspector observed Respondents Josh Luttrell and Phillip Moore making suspected pesticide applications at the ASU farm complex in Jonesboro. Upon inspection it was confirmed that they were applying pesticides without being registered as agents and not under the direct supervision of a qualified trainer.
- 3. Arkansas Pest Control Law states in part the following,
 - "17-37-102. Definitions.
 - ...(13) "Pest control service" means any person who, for compensation, gives advice or engages in work to prevent, control, or repel arthropods, mammals, birds, reptiles, or wood-damaging or wood-destroying organisms that may invade or infest homes, other buildings, or similar structures and shall include arthropods, mammals, birds, reptiles, weeds, and plant diseases that may invade, infest, or infect shade trees, shrubs, lawns, turf, and pecan

groves. This term shall also include any person who issues letters of clearance, or who shall solicit such work in any manner, but the term shall not be construed to include agricultural crops from planting to harvest other than those mentioned above...

17-37-213. Agents and solicitors generally.

- (a) Each licensed operator shall register with the board the name and address of each agent or solicitor and shall pay to the board a registration fee annually for each solicitor and agent, at the time of registration..."
- 5. Rules and Regulations of the State Plant Board contained in the Circular 6 state in part the following,
- "5. Agent Training, Examination, and Registration:

...Until registered, and only during the initial 45 day on the job training and examination period, the agent trainee may apply pesticides only in the physical presence of a commercial applicator or registered agent.... If at any time an employee, other than a commercial applicator, registered agent, or agent trainee undergoing the initial 45 days of on-the-job training and examination preparation, is found handling pesticides or performing pesticide applications the license holder and/or the licensed operator/s will be subject to enforcement action as per the Arkansas State Plant Board Pest Control Enforcement Response Regulations – Penalty Matrix – Violation #9 – beginning at the 3rd level of enforcement..."

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

For the purpose of settlement, as a resolution to the alleged violation and without an evidentiary hearing, Respondents agree and stipulate to the following:

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the ASPB Pest Control Enforcement Response Regulations, Penalty Matrix Violation # 9 Major (Failure of licensee to register agents or solicitors), Respondents shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$1400.00 to which Respondents shall be jointly and severally liable for payment.
- 2. Respondents acknowledge and agree that subsequent like violations of the Pest Control Law within three years of April 3, 2024, will be enforced at the next level of the ASPB Enforcement Response Policy Penalty Matrix and will be subject to penalties as allowed for in Ark. Code Ann. § 17-37-103.

- 3. Respondents shall remit payment to the Department the above amount no later than forty-five (45) days after the acceptance and approval of this agreement by the Plant Board.
- 4. This agreement shall not become a valid and enforceable order of the Plant Board unless and until accepted and approved by the Plant Board at an official meeting and executed by the Chair of the Board or designee.

Code Ann. § 17-37-101 et. seq. and the rules promulgated thereunder by the Arkansas State Plant Board (Plant Board).

In lieu of a formal hearing on this complaint, and in the interest of prompt and speedy settlement of the alleged violations specifically addressed herein, consistent with the public interest, statutory requirements, and the responsibilities of the Plant Board, the undersigned parties enter into this Consent Agreement as a final disposition of this matter. This agreement shall settle and resolve only those alleged violations specifically addressed herein. It is agreed and stipulated by the parties as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent N. E. A. Turf Care, Inc., employs Respondents Gary Camp, Zach Johnson, and Brady Sterns.
- 2. Respondent N. E. A. Turf Care, Inc. is represented by Gary Camp.
- Respondent Gary Camp holds a Classification 4 Ornamental Tree and Turf Pest Control license; and is the immediate supervisor for Respondents Zach Johnson and Brady Sterns.
- 4. Respondent Zach Johnson is a Registered Agent who was the qualified trainer onsite training Brady Sterns before taking the agent examination.
- On April 10, 2024, the Department's Pest Control Program staff observed Respondent N. E. A. Turf Care, Inc.'s employees making an application from a hose reel sprayer in Paragould, wearing no gloves. It was determined that Respondent Zach Johnson and Brady Sterns was making an application of Lesco Three-Way (EPA Reg #10404-43) while not wearing gloves.
- 6. The product label for Lesco Three-Way (EPA Reg #10404-43) states in part the following:

"PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE):

Some materials that are chemical-resistant to this product are made of any waterproof material. All mixers, loaders, applicators, and other handlers must wear:

- Long-sleeved shirt and long pants
- Shoes plus socks,
- Protective eyewear (goggles, face shield or safety glasses)*
- Chemical-resistant gloves made of barrier laminate, butyl rubber (\geq 14 mils), neoprene rubber (\geq 14 mils), or viton (\geq 14 mils)
- Chemical-resistant apron when mixing or loading, cleaning up spills or equipment, or otherwise exposed to the concentrate.

*Eye protection is not required ONLY when 5 or more parts water is used to dilute 1 part of product."

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

For the purpose of settlement, as a resolution to the alleged violation and without an evidentiary hearing, Respondents agree and stipulate to the following:

- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the ASPB Pest Control Enforcement Response Regulations, Penalty Matrix Violation # 2. Major ("Pesticide recommendations or <u>applications</u> which are inconsistent with any/or all the following: A. Labeling") Respondents shall pay a civil penalty of \$600.00, which Respondents shall be jointly and severally liable for payment.
- 2. Respondents acknowledge and agree that subsequent like violations of the Pest Control Law within three years of April 10, 2024, will be enforced at the next level of the ASPB Enforcement Response Policy Penalty Matrix and will be subject to penalties as allowed for in Ark. Code Ann. § 17-37-103.
- 3. Respondents shall remit payment to the Department of Agriculture the above amount no later than forty-five (45) days after the acceptance and approval of this agreement by the Plant Board.
- 4. This agreement shall not become a valid and enforceable order of the Plant Board unless and until accepted and approved by the Plant Board at an official meeting and executed by the Chair of the Board or designee.

WARNING LETTERS

CF20-0268 Joseph B. Blundell (Drift)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Joseph Blundell, Commercial Applicator, made an aerial application of Grazon Next HL and Remedy Ultra to Little Red River Levee for burndown for Little Red River Levee Dist. 1 on June 3, 2020. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Porter's cotton. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

CF20-0277 Glenn Kale (Record Keeping – Class H and Class F)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Glenn Kale, Private Applicator, made burndown applications of Qt of RU and 1½ pt. of Brash to 4 fields on March 2, 2020, 10 fields on March 6, 2020, 6 fields on March 9, 2020, and 4 fields on March 26, 2020. Mr. Kale also made applications of 22 ounces of Dicamba and 2.75 ounces of Zidua to 4 fields on May 18, 2020, 10 fields on May 19, 2020, 6 fields on May 20, 2020, and 4 fields on May 21, 2020. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

CF21-0029 Ronny Rogers (Buffer Zone)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Ronny Rogers, Commercial Applicator, made an aerial application of Roundup PowerMAX and Leadoff to 373 acres in the Bennett 3 field for burndown for Mr. Bruce Koehn on April 18, 2021. The evidence shows the application was made joining Mr. Kitchens' property; which would be inside the 100 foot aerial buffer zone requirement for Roundup PowerMAX; thus, this is considered a buffer zone violation. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Douglas' soybeans. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

<u>CF21-0120 James Caleb Jones (Buffer Zone - Class H)</u>

The Plant Board alleged Mr. James Caleb Jones, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Tavium, Sentris, and Drift Buster to 80 acres of soybeans on June 26, 2021 to the Frog Pond Field. The evidence shows the application was made within approximately 30 feet of Mr. Douglas' non dicamba-tolerant soybean field which would be inside the ¼ mile buffer zone requirement for Class H Products; thus, this is considered a buffer zone violation. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

<u>CF22-0045 Thomas Kyle Sealy (Drift – Class F)</u>

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Curtis Heidelberger, operating under Mr. Thomas Kyle Sealy's Private Applicator License, made a preemergence ground application of Boundary 6.5 EC, Enlist One, and Roundup PowerMAX 3 to 223.9 acres of soybeans in the Buckshot field. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Brewer's corn. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

<u>CF22-0045 Curtis Heidelberger (No Training Certificate – Class F)</u>

The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Bednar's rice. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

CF22-0101 Nick Templeton (Buffer Zone)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Nick Templeton, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Stam M4, Prize, and Promote to 35 acres of rice in the South Tuckerman field on June 17, 2022. The evidence shows the application was made within approximately 200 feet of Mr. Bundy's tomato plants which would be inside the ¼ mile buffer zone requirement for Quinclorac; thus, this is considered a buffer zone violation. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

CF22-0206 William Earl Oxner, III (Drift - Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. William Earl Oxner, III, Private Applicator, made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to soybeans in the Block Building field on an unknown date. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Davis's soybeans. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

CF22-0206 William Earl Oxner, III (Buffer Zone – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. William Earl Oxner, III, Private Applicator, made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to soybeans in the Block Building field on an unknown date. The Plant Board alleged Mr. William Earl Oxner, III, Private Applicator, made an application of an unknown product containing dicamba to soybeans in the Block Building field on an unknown date. Mr. Oxner could not provide the training certificate required for the application. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

CF23-0056 Michael Darin Walton (Drift – Class H)

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Michael Darin Walton, Commercial Applicator, made an aerial application of Buccaneer 5 Extra and Detonate to 38 acres in the Leveled SE field for Mr. Marty White for burndown on March 30, 2023. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Welch's lawn and trees. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

<u>CF23-0056 Michael Darin Walton (Buffer Zone – Class H)</u>

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Michael Darin Walton, Commercial Applicator, made an aerial application of Buccaneer 5 Extra and Detonate to 38 acres in the Leveled SE field for Mr. Marty White for burndown on March 30, 2023. The evidence shows the application was made within approximately 48 feet of Mr. Welch's property which would be inside the 100 foot buffer zone requirement for Buccaneer 5 Extra; thus, this is considered a buffer zone violation. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Minor violation. The proposed enforcement action for this violation is a Warning Letter.

SIGNED CONSENT AGREEMENTS

CF21-0029 Ronny Rogers (Drift)

The Plant Board alleged Ronny Rogers, Commercial Applicator, made an aerial application of Roundup PowerMAX and Leadoff to 373 acres in the Bennett 3 field for burndown for Mr. Bruce Koehn on April 18, 2021. The evidence shows this application drifted off target onto Mr. Kitchens's property. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level III Major violation. Mr. Rogers agrees to a Civil Penalty of \$800 for settlement of the allegation.

<u>CF21-0156 Rusty Taylor (Use of an Unregistered Product – Class H)</u>

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Rusty Taylor, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Xtendimax (EPA Reg.# 524-617) and Reign to 250 acres of soybeans in the C2 field on June 28, 2021. The evidence shows the application was made after December 20, 2020 (date the registration for this product expired); thus, is considered use of an unregistered Class H product. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Major violation. Mr. Taylor agrees to a Civil Penalty of \$400 for settlement of the allegation.

<u>CF21-0156 Rusty Taylor (Record Keeping – Class H)</u>

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Rusty Taylor, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Xtendimax (EPA Reg.# 524-617) and Reign to 250 acres of soybeans in the C2 field on June 28, 2021. The evidence shows Mr. Taylor failed to keep the proper records by not recording the total amount applied, receipts of purchase, product label, buffer requirement, sensitive crops awareness, air temperature, and nozzle pressure. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Major violation. Mr. Taylor agrees to a Civil Penalty of \$300 for settlement of the allegation.

<u>CF21-0156 Rusty Taylor (Buffer Zone – Class H)</u>

The Plant Board alleged Mr. Rusty Taylor, Private Applicator, made a postemergence ground application of Xtendimax (EPA Reg.# 524-617) and Reign to 250 acres of soybeans in the C2 field on June 28, 2021. The evidence shows the application was made within ¼ mile of Mr. Stephens' non dicamba-tolerant soybean field which would be inside the ¼ mile buffer zone requirement for Class H Products; thus, this is considered a buffer zone violation. The Arkansas State Plant Board's Pesticide Enforcement Response Regulation's Penalty Matrix defines this violation as a Level I Major violation. Mr. Taylor agrees to a Civil Penalty of \$400 for settlement of the allegation.



DRONES

GENERAL INFORMATION

Drones are considered aircraft per FAA and the Arkansas Department of Agriculture. Routine inspections are conducted throughout the state regarding the sale and use of pesticides. All equipment is currently classified as air or ground and not specifically by drones.

Drone applications are considered aerial applications. Anyone making applications by drone must follow the Federal label instructions for aerial applications along with any applicable State laws and rules. If applications made by a drone **cannot** comply with the Federal and State requirements, then it would be considered a violation.

LICENSES NEEDED TO APPLY PESTICDES BY DRONE

If a pesticide application is made for hire by air (drone is considered air) the following is needed:

- Commercial Firm License with aerial category, including insurance.
- Individual Commercial License with aerial category and other applicable categories needed (i.e. agriculture plants)

If an individual is applying pesticides to their own land by air (drone is considered air) then the following license is needed.

Private Applicator with pilot Authorization

FAA Requirements

- Pilot license under FAA Part 107 (drone)
- Part 137 Dispensing Chemicals and Agricultural Products via UAS
- Section 44807 waiver Special Authority for Certain Unmanned Aircraft Systems (over 55 lbs.)







T40 with Disc 1: Coarse and Extra Coarse Setting



Coverage & Weed Control

Collaboration between Dr. Tommy Butts, Dr. Jason Davis, and Dr. Terry Spurlock

Two separate studies conducted:

- 1. Evaluating all-around spray coverage on water sensitive paper with varying application types, nozzle types, and spray volumes
- 2. Evaluating top of canopy coverage and weed control from the same application treatments.
- Coverage only study data collection consisted of water sensitive paper placed in three locations (top, front, and back).
- Weed control study had paraquat 3SE (32 fl oz/ac) plus NIS (0.25% v/v) applied to naturally-occurring populations of winter annual weeds as a spring burndown application.








Efficacy Conclusions

- Results suggest that RPAAS operated at 5 GPA can provide equivalent coverage and weed control as a ground sprayer operated at 10 GPA.
- Spray coverage was impacted by more than simply nozzle type and application setup including things like wind direction, surface conditions, nozzle design (dual-fan vs. single-fan), and nozzle orientation.
- Nozzle type did not consistently influence weed control across application setups; however, visual observations indicated nozzle selection significantly influenced the effective swath width of the RPAAS application.
- Further research is needed to evaluate new application system designs, optimal swath widths, heights, and speeds (T40 and T50 series)



 - Beyond visual line of sight

Summary

- RPAAS systems have many advantages when it comes to safe application access.
- There are many field efficiency limitations that are continually improving.
- It is a quickly evolving and increasingly adopted technology
- There is still much to be learned regarding application parameters particularly in cropping systems.
- Both Federal and State regulations (and labels) need refinement to properly direct these applicator as we are integrating them into our cropping systems
