Ten Arkansas Schools Selected to Participate in Annual Shade Trees on Playgrounds Program

LITTLE ROCK, AR — The Arkansas Department of Agriculture has selected ten schools to participate in the 2024 Shade Trees on Playgrounds (STOP) program:

Selected schools will receive up to five native shade trees, mulch, watering supplies, and planting guidelines. Participants must attend a virtual STOP workshop, incorporate curriculum on the importance of trees and forestry in Arkansas, hold a tree-planting ceremony, and commit to long-term maintenance. Department staff will assist with tree transport and planting, ensuring species are suited to each playground's unique conditions.
